Welcome to the 'EU Environmental Law' course!

Here I send you some background materials and the most important information related to the requirements.

1. The course shall cover the topics as presented at the course program:

2. The requirements:

A. The minimum or general requirements (which is enough for those, who do not need a mark or grade at the end of the course, only a certificate of attendance with a three-degree qualification (not excepted, excepted, excepted with merits) are

- to visit the classes (3 absence is allowed) in order to understand, what is going on :) and actively participate;

+ a short – approx 5 pages – paper on a court case within environmental law.

The best would be to select from among the recent (1-2 year old) cases of the CJEU or the ECHR, but it is also possible to write about a domestic judicial case with high significance.

The paper should not be a simple summary, but a kind of analysis of the case as such or of one or more interesting aspects of it. Please, send it to my e-mail address till May 16th, the latest. You may send it earlier, of course.

I would like to ask you to send a note also to other colleagues about your choice of the case to be presented, in order to avoid overlaps. It would be recommended to send your papers to the colleagues, also. This would mean that everybody may have a bunch of interesting case-summaries at the end of the course.

B. Those, who need a grade or mark at the end, different from what is mentioned above, shall have a written exam (test) at our last meeting, May 14th. The exam shall cover those questions, which we discuss during the course. Also you may find useful materials at our website, but if you listen carefully to the presentations, it is enough for a success. The exam is a test, you should select the right answer or provide some short answers.
